## A Tenebrae Service<sup>1</sup>

People are encouraged to enter quietly and sombrely.

If possible, have the full hymns / songs and verses from hymns / songs printed for people to have during the service. These should then be sung unannounced, so that there is no interruption in the flow of the service.

If possible, all songs should be sung unaccompanied.

## **WE GATHER AT THE CROSS**

A giant cross is brought into the church. The cross bearer proceeds very slowly, pausing at a half-dozen locations briefly. When he/she arrives at the front of the worship space, she/he sets the cross upright in a stand, or rests it against a wall.

The Call to Worship Succinct, and a welcome to the journey of walking through the

seven words of Jesus and visiting the scene of the cross.

The tolling of the bell A bell is rung seven times, slowly, to remind all worshipers of

the fullness of Jesus' suffering. After the seventh ring, a pause

of silence for reflection is helpful.

During the tolling, the lights of the church can be gradually dimmed, so that only a light on the empty cross remains.
